Every Friday the Frosty Drew Observatory opens its doors at 6pm for solar viewing and keeps them open well into the evening, usually until 2 or 3am if the sky's clear enough. Rosecliff has an exhibit about Oscar Wilde's time in Rhode Island. The big Zoobilee! gala for Roger Williams Park Zoo allows visitors to "feast with the beasts", while Newport's Audrain Auto Museum opens its summer exhibition of quirky vehicles. For something completely different, Wednesday Night Knockouts is a weekly summer pinball tournament taking place in a strip mall in West Greenwich.

Jamestown's wacky Fools Rules Regatta is a build-your-own-boat adventure that's been going on since 1978.
